

## **YEMEN**



- Supported the Ministry of Finance to rollout an electronic salary payment program.
- Supported the Central Bank of Yemen to manage a competitive foreign exchange auction to bolster the currency.
- Helped private banks develop innovative financing models to improve access to finance.
- Delivered technical training to more than 8,000 farmers, increasing some of their revenues by as much as 45%.

- Educated 190,000 children through non-formal, formal, and remedial education programs.
- Provided essential teaching and learning kits to 8,000 students and 320 teachers in 80 schools.
- Upgraded and rehabilitated 36 education facilities and constructed 6 water, sanitation, and hygiene facilities.
- Helped 14,982 vulnerable students benefit from remedial classes and summer clubs to boost their academic performance.
- Partnered with the Ministry of Education to distribute 424,000 new literacy and numeracy textbooks to 100,000 primary school students across 400 schools for the first time since 2014.

- Supported 78 health facilities with training and medical equipment, improving access to health care services for an estimated 5.7 million Yemenis.
- Trained 1,231 health care providers.
- Provided family planning services to 647,000 women.
- Reached 5,705,850 people with maternal and child health messages.
- ◆ Trained and deployed 331 community midwives in remote areas to provide basic health services and referrals.
- Supported the building of medical oxygen plants, making south Yemen self-sufficient in medical oxygen capacity.







- Helped 1.8 million Yemenis access clean water, improved sanitation services, and increased hygiene awareness since 2018.
- Rehabilitated water systems to provide access to safe water for 650,000 Yemenis.
- Improved sanitation for more than 600,000 Yemenis by repairing sewage networks, constructing household latrines, and installing toilets and handwashing stations at health facilities.
- ◆ Trained more than **500,000 Yemenis** on hygiene practices to curb diseases.

- ◆ Contributed to a 28% increase in community members' level of trust in local institutions.
- Enhanced negotiation, networking, and communications skills of 61 female political party leaders.
- Reached 9 million Yemenis through an educational online platform on conflict and climate change.
- Strengthened community organizing and program design skills of 31 youth organization representatives.

- Provided emergency food assistance to an average of 1.8 million Yemenis per month to combat food insecurity and malnutrition.
- Provided emergency cash assistance to vulnerable households across 20 governorates.
- Supported 3 million people in 2024 with water, sanitation, and hygiene activities, including safe drinking water, sanitation facilities, and promotion of improved hygiene practices.
- Provided therapeutic food to more than half a million Yemeni children under five years old suffering from severe acute malnutrition in 2024.
